Bullying = intentionally aggressive behaviour, repeated over time, that involves an imbalance of power.

School Band Program

Dear Parents,

Today your child attended a demonstration showcasing the instruments available to learn at school in 2023. If you would like more information please register your interest using the link or QR code below within the next **5 days**.

Once you have registered your child's interest TSA will then conduct instrument trials at school to help your child discover which instrument they are most suited to (this will take place within strict COVID-safe guidelines). Following the instrument trials, an *Enrolment Pack* will be sent home with your child. This will contain more detailed information about the school band program along with the result of their instrument trial.

Band Program Structure

Rehearsal (all students work together in a full band setting)

Once a week, generally before or after school, for 30-60 minutes

Tuition (students work in small groups or individually to learn new skills)

• 30min per week, at school, usually on the same day as rehearsal

Students attend both rehearsal and tuition at school. Regular practise at home (3-4 times a week) is essential.

Band Program Costs

Tuition Fees: small group tuition and band rehearsal costs \$210 (plus \$10 resource levy) per term. Individual tuition costs extra and is not available at all schools.

Instrument: students require their own instrument. TSA sells quality new instruments, offers 'rent-to-buy' (starting at \$43 per month) and has an excellent selection of second hand instruments in near-new condition.

Accessories: students are provided with a workbook upon enrolment but may require other accessories, generally less than \$50 per year.

How to register your child's interest in the band



Glenorie Public School Text Books 2023

Dear parents and caregivers,

This year our students will again be using textbooks to support their learning and for homework. Class teachers worked together to identify the most appropriate texts for each class (stage) each year. The following is a list of the texts that your child will use in 2023. Texts will be used from early Term One. It would be greatly appreciated if you purchase your child's textbook package by <u>Week 3 Term 1</u> or payment can be made any time this term.

The P&C and school have worked together to identify a fair and reasonable voluntary contribution fee to request from families on an annual basis. Each year the Department of Education provides schools with a budget for general operations. The P&C cover the cost of Mathletics for your child. Additional fundraising and the collection of School Contributions allow schools to purchase items to further support the educational needs of students.

A technology fee is included to support and supply your child with their own notebook or iPad at school and connect you with your child via SeeSaw.

Our school's global budget is used to purchase and maintain most items that you see within our school (excluding permanent staff members' salaries). We are responsible for purchasing books, pencils, games, computer software, toilet paper, ... *virtually everything*. The additional funds collected will allow us to purchase more equipment, books, maths games, computers, ... for **YOUR** child.

Many local schools charge high amounts for school contributions. Our goal is to keep the amount affordable to ensure all families can contribute.

Please complete the slip below and return it to <u>your child's classroom teacher</u> with the <u>correct</u> <u>money or cheque</u> (made out to Glenorie Public School) or <u>pay online</u> by Friday 10th February 2023. <u>Part-payment will not be accepted</u>.

Thank you for supporting your child's classroom teacher by ensuring that you pay for the above items as soon as possible.

Students will be issued their textbooks as their payment is processed. So it is important to make this payment on or before the due day.

Any families experiencing financial difficulties and unable to purchase our textbook package should contact Mrs Pearce.
