COVID/ Influenza Updates

The department's winter plan is designed to help protect students, staff and families from the increased spread of infectious diseases throughout Terms 2 and 3. Given the current high levels of student and staff illness, our layered COVID-smart measures in schools will continue into Term 3 to prioritise student and staff wellbeing while keeping schools operational.

Our layered COVID-smart measures include:

- rapid antigen tests (RATs) for symptomatic testing and daily testing for close contacts returning to school
- maximising natural ventilation
- enhanced hygiene and cleaning
- strongly encouraging vaccination for students and staff
- staying home if unwell.

Additionally, while mask-wearing remains optional for most department staff, students and staff who wish to wear a mask will continue to be supported to do so.

Athletics Day Carnival

The K-6 Athletics Carnival will be held on Thursday 11 August at Les Shore Oval. We hope all parents and friends will be able to join in and provide encouragement.
