COVID/ Influenza Updates

Students identified as close contacts remain able to attend school provided they are symptom-free, notify the school and return a negative COVID-19 test result daily for 5 consecutive school days. Primary students, while not required, are strongly encouraged to wear a mask for 5 consecutive school days (except when eating/drinking or exercising). Please note that students identified as close contacts are still unable to attend overnight excursions, including camps. Visitors identified as close contacts who are engaging directly with students are required to return a negative COVID-19 test result before attending our school and wear a mask. Rapid antigen tests (RATs) have been sent out to all students this week. A pack of 5 tests were sent home in your child's bag on Monday.

This year we will be celebrating Book Week and Grandparent's Day during Education Week (1st-5th August).

The theme for this year's Book Week is **Dreaming with eyes open**. The theme encourages children to view reading as dreaming with your eyes open. Well-written stories stimulate the imagination and allow the reader to dream themselves into the book. They can travel to other places and times and into imaginary worlds. The artwork that is displayed in the library is one interpretation of this year's theme. Please come and see it when you visit the library on Grandparent's Day.



In addition to exploring the Book Week theme during Term Three, we will also enjoy discovering a range of children's literature shortlisted for the Book of the Year Awards by the Children's Book Council of Australia (CBCA). These new titles are also on display in our library.

COVID-19 restrictions have changed the way we have celebrated Book Week and Grandparent's Day over the last couple of years, so this year we are really looking forward to encouraging the school community to participate in the events planned for the day.

Our celebrations will be held on Tuesday, 2nd August when families and grandparents are invited to join us for an action-packed Open Day. A detailed timetable of activities will be distributed closer to the day, but events will include:

- 1. A morning tea in the library for grandparents.
- 2. A Scholastic Book Fair running all day for children to purchase books. Parents and grandparents are also invited to purchase books to donate to the library if they wish.
- 3. A Book Parade- students will choose a book character that helps them *Dream with their eyes open* and dress up as that character to participate in a book parade.
- 4. A whole school assembly with performances from each Stage group.
- 5. A choir performance by our Year 3 Choir.
- 6. Open classrooms where you will be able to visit your child's or grandchild's classroom to meet the teacher and view some of their work.
- 7. A picnic lunch with your family at school. There will also be a Cake Stall hosted by Year Six.

Book Parade

Students are required to dress up as their favourite book characters for the Book Parade following lunch. Costumes do not have to be purchased, but students are encouraged to dress up as characters using items they already have for the Parade. If a particular character cannot be agreed upon, then maybe a costume focusing on this year's Book Week theme of **Dreaming with eyes open** might be appropriate.

Book Fair

Every class will view the fair next week in their library lesson. When they visit, they will be given a 'Wish List' on which they can record the title, location, and price of any books they are interested in purchasing.

If students and their carers are attending the fair in person on the day, students may wish to bring their Wishlist to assist them in locating their chosen book.

If caregivers are not attending the Book Fair, they will need to:

- 1) highlight the book/s from the student Wish List
- 2) pay the total amount via credit card on the scholastic site: www.scholastic.com.au/payment
- 3) record the first 6 digits of the receipt number issued following payment.
- 4) record the students' name, and the amount paid. The student will then bring their Wish List to the fair on Tuesday 2nd August and will present it to a staff member who will give them the books/ items to take home.

Some parents may wish to make a general payment to Scholastic and allow their child to spend it at the fair on a range of books/ stationery items.

If families wish to donate an amount to the school library, this amount can be included in the one receipt number, but **clearly indicating on the Wish List how much is to be donated to the library**. There will be a number of preferred book titles to purchase for the library on display.

If a chosen book is out of stock on the fair day, it can simply be reordered, and the student will be issued the title as soon as stock arrives at the school.

Students will bring their Wish List home over the next week and should be brought to the fair on Tuesday 2nd August. A copy of the Wish List is attached for your convenience.




It is recommended you take a photo of the Wish List and payment details in case your child loses it.

Can I please bring to your attention that if for some reason you miss the cut-off time to order your child's lunch, please make sure your child comes to the canteen BEFORE school starts to place their order as all food is prepared early and if they wish to order hot food this needs to go into the oven early to ensure it is ready by lunch time.

Additionally, moving into term three we are welcoming "Canteen Champions".

Our Canteen services are not only vitally important to support our families but also an integral part of our school community, culture and enjoyment for the children. The Canteen can only function with the support from volunteering parents.

Unfortunately, there has been a lack of assistance in volunteers, leaving our canteen short staffed on many occasions. If this continues the school would have to consider the possibility of decreasing its operating days.

We are enthusiastically introducing a new volunteer system "Canteen Champions". A grade will be allocated 2 weeks per term, where it will be the responsibility of parents with children in that year to assist in filling in the gaps where a volunteer is needed in the canteen.
