All classes are completely parallel and of mixed abilities. Invariably, some decisions around class and teacher placement will get different reactions and yet, we do our children absolutely no favours if we intervene and seek to change decisions. For a range of reasons, I am asked by some parents to swap children out of their new classes. Whilst each request seems imperative to the parent making it, the reality is that such a practice would open the floodgates of requests from other parents. Regrettably, the school is not able to grant any such requests, and therefore we would prefer not to be put in the awkward situation of being asked. Class splits each year are a complex process. Much thought and consideration take place by staff and overall, we seek to provide balanced classes where needs and strengths are stable across the grades. Your child will not necessarily get on with everyone in the group, yet we teach them nothing if we seek to filter this completely. Regarding teacher placement, I would be delighted if any of my grandchildren had a teacher at Glenorie Public School. It is an important life lesson that we don't always receive who or what we want. It is vitally important that parents look at the positives and pass these onto their children when classes and teachers are announced. Parents who do this well, provide their children with the best possibility of success.

Multi-age classes are made up of students drawn from different year levels. They may be established because of the uneven pattern of enrolment in the school, because of the small size of the school or where it's considered that mixing students of different ages is academically and socially advantageous. These multi-age classes are often designed to match the organisation of the syllabus, which is based on 'stages' running over two years.

It is with great sadness that we said goodbye to Mr Gornalle in the holidays who took a position on the Central Coast. We wish him all the best in the future at his new school. Mr Gornalle has been replaced by Mrs Karen Thomas who will join us on Monday on 3T. Mrs Thomas is a very experienced teacher, and we welcome her

Our school and communities will make sure that written communication is appropriate, fair, and easy to read. We encourage you to use email and social media appropriately to connect with your school and stay up to date with events in the school community.

In all workplaces, people have the right to feel respected. Unacceptable and offensive behaviour has no place in our school communities.

To ensure the safety and well-being of students, staff and the community in our schools, steps will be taken to address unacceptable behaviour. This may include restricting contact with the school community or, in more serious cases, referral to NSW Police.

Unacceptable behaviour may include but is not limited to:

- Aggressive or intimidating actions, such as violence, threatening gestures or physical proximity.
- Aggressive or intimidating language, including the use of obscenities, making sexist, racist or derogatory comments or using a rude tone.
- Treating school community members differently due to aspects such as their religion or disability.
- Inappropriate and time-wasting communication.
- Defaming staff members on social media.

Peanut & Eggs at School????

This year we have students with severe (potentially life-threatening) peanut products/ dairy and egg allergies. As a general rule we ask, that no child brings peanut products to school (especially nut-based spreads such as peanut butter and Nutella). Please talk to your child/ren about not sharing food at school. In the interests of the two students' well-being, thank you for supporting our peanut-free school policy.

New Enrolments

If you know of new families moving into the Glenorie area, please encourage them to contact the school office for enrolment forms. Parents enrolling students will need to present birth certificates, immunization records and 100 points of proof of residence (e.g. rates notice, license, medicare). Students not in the drawing area will have to seek enrolment at their local school.

The P&C Working For Your Children

Last year our school P&C worked exceptionally hard to provide additional opportunities for your children. Many of the additional resources (computers, playground equipment, Mathletics subscription, Reading Eggs subscription, etc.) were purchased as a direct result of the work of our P&C. They supply all the extras for our students, provide our students' lunches on Monday and Friday, and supply all our students with their uniforms, all on a volunteer basis. That is an amazing effort. A big thank you to Uniform Shop team for opening up the uniform shop to assist our new families to purchase uniforms.
