## What if my child is absent from school?

Parents must provide an explanation to the school within 7 days of the first day of any period of absence. This can either be done on our school App or by filling in one of our convenient slips/providing a note written to the teacher explaining why your child/ren missed school. If the school does not receive an explanation of the absence from the parents within 7 days, the office will send a letter to parents within 2 school days after the 7-day timeframe has elapsed.

## The Tell Them From Me Parent feedback survey

I am delighted that this term our school, like many others in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them from Me* parent feedback survey. The *Partners in Learning* parent survey is for parents and carers of school students. It is designed to clarify and strengthen the important relationship between parents/carers and school by gaining insights into parent/carer and staff communication, activities and practices at home, and parent/carer voice on school support of learning and behaviour. The survey results help to build an accurate and timely picture that schools can use for practical improvements. It complements the student and teacher surveys.

#### How does it work?

Parents/carers take the survey online in their own time. The survey usually takes less than 15 minutes and is anonymous.

Schools in Australia and around the world have used the *Tell Them from Me* survey to help improve how they do things at school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential and school staff will not be able to identify individual parents from their responses. The survey must be conducted online. Our school will provide further information about how to access the survey closer to the start date.

The student, parent, and teacher surveys will open on Monday 4 September and run until Friday 3 November 2023.

The survey will be emailed to all parents, including the link so it is more accessible. Please take time to complete the survey, as we need as many parents as possible to respond so the information is useful. Thank you.

## **Great Book Swap for the Indigenous Literacy Foundation**

## **Exciting news! The Great Book Swap is back!**

Over the last couple of years the Covid Pandemic prevented us from hosting our annual Great Book Swap However, in Term 4 (Week2) we will host it again! The event raises money for the Indigenous Literacy Foundation (ILF) and increases awareness of the literacy gaps in opportunities between urban and rural communities.

### Why are we hosting the event?

The *Great Book Swap* is a fantastic way to celebrate reading and learn more about Indigenous Languages and culture, while raising funds for the Indigenous Literacy Foundation. The idea is to swap a favourite book in exchange for a gold coin donation.

This year, we are aiming to raise \$180,000! By hosting the event our school will be actively helping us gift 18,000 new, carefully chosen books to children in remote communities across the country. Student gold coin donations will help fund the ILF Book Supply Program that reaches over 400 remote communities.

## How will the event work?

The idea is that a favourite *book* is *swapped* in exchange for a gold coin donation. On Tuesday and Wednesday of Week 2 (October 16<sup>th</sup>/ 17<sup>th</sup>), donated books from the school community will be displayed in the library at lunchtime. Students on the **Monday** will **donate a gold coin** to enter the library and take home a chosen book to keep. On the **Tuesday** if students wish to visit the event again, they can donate another coin and can take several books. Not only do students get to take home a book of their choice, but they contribute to raising funds for Indigenous literacy!

### What books can students donated?

If you happen to be doing some early spring cleaning, please keep some books aside to donate to a great cause. Books will be collected from students in their classroom next week and we will continue to collect your books until the event.

Please ensure that books that students bring in to donate are in a good condition. No baby books please, and chapter books are particularly welcome.



Thank you for your ongoing support and see you soon to collect pre-loved books for the Great Book Swap.

## TRICKY TALKS - WHERE DID I COME FROM? AND PREPARING FOR PUBERTY.

Interrelate "Tricky Talks" - Thursday 21st September 2023 - 6pm ONLINE

Back by popular demand, the P & C have organised for the Interrelate 'Tricky Talks' Program to be presented **online** again on **Thursday, 21st September 2023 from 6pm**.

Interrelate's 'Tricky Talks' program involves two one-hour live presentations designed to give an overview of issues that preteens will experience. These sessions aim to create a framework for parents and children to begin having conversations about uncomfortable topics such as the structure and functions of the reproductive system in males and females, conception, foetal development including birth, physical changes and emotional changes at puberty that children begin to start asking about at these ages.

The first session is titled 'Where Did I Come From?' and will begin the discussion on the male and female reproductive systems, as well as placing an emphasis on personal safety and protective behaviors. In the past, this session has been recommended for children in year 3 and over. This session will run between 6:00pm - 7:00pm AEDT.

The second session is titled 'Preparing For Puberty.' In this session, we discuss the physical changes of puberty, putting emphasis on the fact that it can be different for everyone. We also build on the first session in enhancing the awareness of a child's personal safety, as well as inform further on protective behaviour. We develop students' understanding of periods and sperm production, as well as the physical, emotional, social and intellectual changes associated with puberty for both boys and girls. This session is recommended for children above Year 5, however, in the past mature Year 3 and 4 students have seen this material. This session will run from 7:15pm - 8:15pm AEDT.


