#### **Sick Bay Referrals**

We have had a number of students referred to the sick bay by classroom teachers throughout the past number of weeks; this may be due to the flu virus that has made its mark on Sydney. It is our school's policy to contact parents if any child presents in an unwell manner. Thanks to the parents who promptly pick up their sick children (if the office staff call you). We have found it difficult to contact some parents because of phone number changes. #### **Digital Diets**

Social networking is a large part of the social identity of young people. They are avid users of a range of social networking services including Facebook, YouTube, Snapchat, Instagram, musically and Twitter. The minimum age to open an account on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Pinterest, Tumblr, Kik, and Snapchat is **13**. These often do not ask children to state their age.

Many kids also network through playing online games like Club Penguin, Moshi Monsters, Fortnite and World of Warcraft.

All of these services provide fun and engaging ways to:

- stay connected and interact with friends and family
- post information and updates about themselves and their activities
- share photos and videos
- chat and play games
- comment on other people's photos, posts and profiles.

It can be difficult to resist the 'pester power' of your kids when it comes to allowing them to engage on social media, especially when their friends may be allowed. There is a risk they may feel alienated, but ultimately you know your child best and whether they can handle the responsibilities and pressures of being on social media.

Social networking can be a great experience for kids but also has clear risks. They may forget who they are communicating with and who might see their posts.

They also may feel braver to say and do things online that they might not do offline including talking to and confiding in strangers. It is important that your child understands the risks associated with disclosing information about themselves and how to manage their privacy and online 'friends'.

In turn, it is important that you are aware of how your kids are interacting with others on these sites and equip them with the skills to manage negative situations, which include:

- cyber bullying
- not protecting their own privacy
- sharing information with people they don't know or trust
- losing control over where a photo or video has been shared
- identity theft
- seeing offensive images and messages
- meeting people in real life who they only know online
- unwanted contact by strangers or predators.

Seven steps to success with screenagers:

- 1. Protect sleep zones and set a 'Digital Sunset'.
- 2. Keep meals free of devices and distractions.
- 3. Cultivate conversations and develop discussions.
- 4. Explain how and why you use your own device.
- 5. Develop your personal principles for digital health.
- 6. Beware of screen time as a behaviour reward.

# Your guide to driving and parking safely near schools

The beginning and end of the school day are busy times for pedestrians and vehicles outside the school. That's why you need to take extra care in 40km/h school zones.

- Park safely and legally, even if it means walking further to the school gate.
   Parking signs are planned with children's safety in mind.
- Slow down to 40km/h in the school zone and stay aware of crossings
- · Always park and turn legally around the school.
- Never double park as it puts children at risk.
- Manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous.
- Never park in a bus zone or in the school bus bay.
- Make sure your children use the Safety Door (rear footpath side door) to get in and out of the car.
- At a supervised crossing, observe the directions of the school crossing supervisor.
- Mode safe and considerate behaviour for your child they will learn from you.

Remember to always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways. Don't park across the school driveway or the entrance to the school car park. It's always a good idea to use the drop off and pick up area suggested by your school. This will help keep all children as safe as possible during the busiest times of the school day.


