### **ANZAC Ceremony Community**

Thank you to all students and families who attended the Glenorie RSL Community ANZAC services. Our School Leaders represented our school with pride and spoke confidently and with sincerity during the ceremonies. We are very proud of them and the students who marched in the parade and showed respectful and responsible behaviour throughout the service.



### **Entering Classrooms**

In the mornings, students may walk to their room and place their bag outside of the classroom in the designated area. Students are not permitted to enter the classroom, wet areas, pods or withdrawal spaces unless with a teacher. We kindly request that parents refrain from entering classrooms without prior arrangement with the respective teacher. Students are also expected to stay out of classrooms unless a teacher is present. These measures are in place to ensure a safe and conducive learning environment for all students, as well as to minimise disruptions during school hours. Also, we respectfully ask that parents refrain from waiting right next to or outside of the classroom doors in the afternoon. This will assist teachers by reducing noise and enabling them to maintain student engagement and attention right up until the afternoon bell.

We deeply value parental involvement and encourage open communication between home and school. Therefore, if you need to meet with a teacher or visit the classroom, please come into the office and ask for assistance or contact the school to schedule an appointment. Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.

### **Playground Routines**

This term we are working with our students to tighten up our playground routines during the morning, as well as the recess and lunch breaks. Students have all been given a space outside of the classroom to place their bag before school. At the beginning of recess and lunch times, teachers will walk students to the playground area. At the end of recess and lunch, K-2 students will assemble briefly before being dismissed from the playground in class groups. Students in years 3-6, are expected to walk back to their classroom and line up outside before entering the room at the direction of their teacher.

We have marked some out of bounds areas on the playground in the top COLA. These areas ensure students are playing in line of sight. Students have been introduced to the new arrangements, and they have responded very positively to the changes.

There have also been some minor changes made to Friday assemblies to increase the formality of this time. The main change for parents and guests, is that the canteen foyer will be closed to parents, and all parents are asked to sit at the back of the hall. There will be an aisle at the side door for parent / pram access. The hall door will be closed at the commencement of the assembly to minimise external noise.

We are very excited to have updated our sand pit toys and the students are enjoying these new resources. At the end of each lunchtime, our sport house captains will lock the equipment away. Also, our bottom COLA play equipment has been cleared for use. We are very happy to have this area back in action!

In order to ensure all students are leaving the Tacoma Drive exit safely at home time, the back car park gate will be closed. All students and parents are asked to use the pedestrian gates to ensure there are no pedestrians in the car park or driveway.


### 'Tell Them From Me' Student Survey


Volunteer in the Canteen .....




